Shaping the Future of Malaysia's National Education Through Reformation



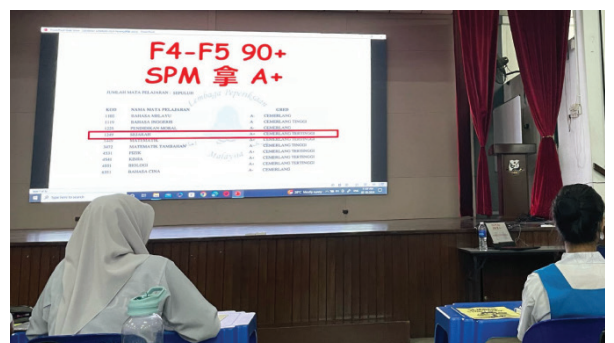
