The Enduring Influence of Von Neumann Architecture in Modern Computing



The Von Neumann Architecture, introduced in 1945 by John von Neumann, is the foundation of most modern computers. It describes a system where a single memory unit stores both instructions and data. In software development,

programming languages and algorithms rely on its fetch-execute cycle, while operating systems optimise memory and processing. However, the Von Neumann bottleneck—limited data transfer speed between the CPU and memory—remains a challenge. In theoretical computer science, this architecture influenced Turing machines and computational complexity theory, shaping models for computability and efficiency analysis. Despite its limitations, the Von Neumann Architecture remains crucial in computing, impacting computer architecture, operating systems, and artificial intelligence. At DISTED, computing students study these principles to strengthen their understanding of modern computing.

Preserving Tradition, Embracing Innovation: A Field Trip to Perniagaan Bedak Sejuk Lean Seng



On 7th February, five lecturers and 18 business students visited Perniagaan Bedak Sejuk Lean Seng in Balik Pulau, Penang, to learn about bedak sejuk, a traditional skincare powder made from rice and water. The family business, started 50 years ago by Mr. Yeoh Song Huat's father, originally followed a year-long fermentation process. To shorten production time, the family experimented with different fermentation periods, finding that one month produced the best results. Despite operating on a small scale with fully handmade production, the business exports bedak sejuk to the USA, where it is repackaged as a luxury face mask. This highlights how traditional products can reach global markets through innovation. The trip reinforced key entrepreneurial lessons—creativity, adaptability, and perseverance. It provided valuable insights into heritage craftsmanship and demonstrated how small businesses can achieve success by thinking strategically and embracing change.
