Green Entrepreneurship

At DISTED, we believe education is beyond the traditional classroom method. The best way to learn is from those who have treaded the journey. As such, for the entrepreneurship development class, Calvin Chan, DISTED's Staffordshire University, Bachelor of Accounting and Finance alum from the class of 2018, was invited as the guest speaker to share his green entrepreneurship journey.

Calvin founded Green Hero in 2019. Green Hero focuses on solving the food waste problem through collaboration with business owners, corporations and volunteers. Since its inception, the company has prevented 40,000 kg of food from landing in landfills. Food excess was channelled back into the system for consumption at a discounted price, benefiting those in need through food banks.

DISTED is so proud of the achievement of our alums, more so since one of the core values of DISTED is to take care of the environment. Through the sharing session, students gained insights into what green entrepreneurship is about and how they can consider venturing into social entrepreneurship to benefit the general society and take care of our environment. DISTED students were also given a realistic preview of the ups and downs of becoming an entrepreneur, the everyday challenges an entrepreneur must face and the joy of the entrepreneurship journey. At the session's end, some students cited their interest in being part of the Green Hero team. DISTED hopes this sharing session will ignite the seed of green entrepreneurship in DISTED's students.

Calvin Chan found his calling at 20 when he won the Penang Green ldol in 2016. His passion for environmentalism led him to set up his own Green Business, which made him speak at TEDx twice. He has also won the

Malaysia Student Entrepreneur award from Entrepreneur Organisation, leading him to represent Malaysia in Macau and Singapore. Calvin started Green Hero as a student. Green Hero managed to rescue 51 meals in 2018 when it first started. In 2019, they saved close to 6000 meals: and during the pandemic 2020-2021, Green Hero, with their NGO partners, managed to rescue 800,000kg of food waste in Penang.

Guest Lecturer from University of Essex, UK

Taking advantage of the visit by Dr Konstantinos Kalliris from the School of Law, University of Essex to Penang, DISTED's School of Pre-University Studies organised a lecture on the topic, "Criminal Law and Crime Prevention: A Reluctant Relationship". According to Dr Kalliris, "Criminal law is one of the most intriguing legal fields and one of the few areas of law that fascinate theorists and practitioners equally. It deals with human conduct

beyond acceptable social norms and is usually extremely harmful. For these reasons, it is sometimes described as 'applied moral philosophy': the law keeps everyone in line and punishes wrongdoers by inflicting them evil. However, despite its long history, retribution is not the only aim of criminal law. As with most things in life, prevention is better than treatment, so criminal punishment is also expected to prevent or reduce crime." The talk

explored how successful 'traditional' criminal punishment has been in this pursuit and how tools from other fields economics, (criminology, and psychology) have changed how we understand crime prevention and criminal law. The lecture was attended by lecturers and students from the SACE international A-levels and programmes.
