On August 10, 2024, the 50th Anniversary of the George Town—Adelaide Sister City Relationship was celebrated at the Penang Institute, organised by the Penang Island City Council (MBPP). The event was graced by Adelaide Lord Mayor, Honourable Jane Lomax Smith, and Penana Mayor, Dato' Ir. Rajendra P. Anthony. It concluded with a grand dinner featuring cultural performances showcasing Penang and Malaysia's rich heritage.

The sister-city relationship between George Town and Adelaide, established on December 8, 1973, has deep historical roots dating back to British colonial origins. This connection originates from the bond between George Town's founder, Francis Light, and Martina Rozells, and their son, Colonel William Light, who founded Adelaide. The relationship was formalised through the efforts of South Australia's Premier Don Dunstan and Penang Chief Minister Tun Dr. Lim Chong Eu, with significant contributions from Dunstan's fiancée, Penang-born Adele Koh.

Over the years, this relationship has facilitated numerous cultural exchanges, economic cooperation, and mutual understanding. Key initiatives have included cultural programmes such as art exhibitions, music and dance performances, and culinary events highlighting each city's unique heritage. Educational institutions in both cities have developed partnerships that include student and faculty exchanges, joint academic programmes, and collaborative

Internal auditors focus on evaluating internal controls, assessing risks, and ensuring regulatory compliance within an organisation. In contrast, external auditors independently examine financial statements to provide opinions on their accuracy, crucial for stakeholders like investors and regulatory bodies. The roles require different skills: internal auditors need strong analytical abilities and a deep understanding of risk management, while external auditors require critical thinking, judgment, and knowledge of accounting principles. Accounting students must understand these differences to make informed career choices. At DISTED, our accounting programmes aim to develop students into proficient auditors, equipping them with the necessary skills and knowledge for successful careers.
